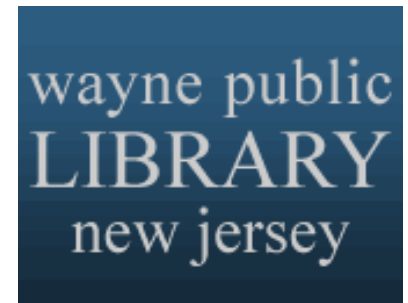

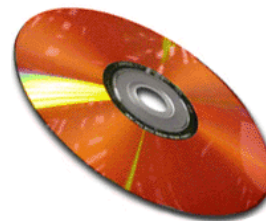

Did you know?

Some DVDs in the library collection have the widescreen version on one side of the disc and the fullscreen version on the other side.

“Handle with Care”

1. Please handle the discs by the outer edge or the center hole.
2. Please use care when removing the DVD from the case. It is frequently necessary to depress the push-button in the hub of the case to release the DVD from the case. Please do not force it or the DVD will crack and will no longer be viewable.
3. Please do not touch the surface of the disc, and do not scratch or write on the label side of the disc.
4. Please keep dirt and other foreign matter from the disc.
5. If the disc is lightly soiled (ie: fingerprints) and you would like to attempt to clean it, please use only isopropyl alcohol and a soft tissue to wipe it from the center outward only.
6. Please do not allow small children to handle the discs.
7. Please use care when placing the disc in the case or in the player tray.
8. Please make sure the disc is properly seated in the player tray before closing it.
9. Please keep discs away from heat sources and direct sunlight (i.e. near a window or in a car during hot weather).



Why won't this disc work in my player?

Discs have become more complex as authoring tools improve, so recent discs often uncover engineering flaws in players. Some discs behave strangely or won't play at all in certain players.

If you have problems playing a disc, try the following:

1. Try playing the disc a few more times. If you don't get the exact same problem every time, then it's probably a defective or damaged disc. Make sure the disc isn't dirty, scratched or damaged. (If damaged, please bring the disc to the attention of the library staff).
2. Try the disc in a different player. (Visit a friend or a nearby store that sells players.) If the disc plays properly in a different player, then your player is likely at fault. Contact the manufacturer of your player for a firmware upgrade. Or, if you bought the player recently, you may wish to return it for a different model.
3. If it's a recordable disc (R/RW), your player might not be able to read it.

If the disc is dirty or scratched ...

Please bring the disc to the attention of the library staff. Through the Friends of the Library, the Wayne Public Library was able to purchase a high-end disc repair machine to clean and buff out scratches on the discs in our collection.

We will do our best to repair the material so that you are able to enjoy it.
